5 council Reps present with another survey to complete and to answer questions. Nothing really presented. 10-12 local residents turned up , 6 from BHPA

Belinda Coates asked re any response from our "issues " letter. None. She assured us that she will be in Natalie's ear tomorrow asking why not. Natalie is in charge of Dept. for Sporting facilities etc.

Matthew Wilson –Director of Community Wellbeing and an associate Bridgette ? Where is LAP from 4 years ago. Dead in the water. Ballarat Our Future replaces the old planning data and hopes to engage community along the way. BHPA reps expressed their frustration with lack of action from many hours and dollars involved in the LAP. They promise to be "doers" not "talkers". We will see.

Brian: Learned from Belinda that the current 3 councillor to a region of Ballarat system will be changing to a single councillor representing 9 smaller regions in 2024. As a group we will need to keep ahead of this boundary allocation as it will change our approach to dealing with council in the future.
